

Dr. Levi Walker's Ledger

Dr. Levi Walker maintained a ledger of his debtors, where he listed each visit and the cost. We have his Ledger B. Apparently Ledger A was small, because Ledger B begins about 1830. There are 675 names in the ledger. He graduated from the University of Pennsylvania Medical School in 1826, and died in September 1844.

The ledger has Alphabetical Index pages that list names and page numbers on which the name appears. When there was no more room on a page, he simply added a new entry on a new page.

The ledger will be donated to the Cross Roads Presbyterian Church History Room on August 14, 2015. Dr. Levi, his parents and grandparents and many other relatives are buried at Cross Roads.

I have scanned all the index pages and a few of the ledger pages which may be of interest. Each ledger entry begins with "DR" followed by a name. We believe that "DR" means "Debtor".
